1	TITLE, STATUS, FOUNDATION AND DURATION
1.1	The International Jukskei Federation, hereafter known as the IJF, is the only
	recognised Sports Federation of international nature, established specifically
	within the sport of Jukskei.
1.2	The IJF is comprised of those recognised National Bodies or International
	Associations (see Clauses 2.16 and 2.27) that have membership status
	according to this Constitution (and/or other recognised Stipulations or
	Regulations of the IJF).
1.3	The IJF (previously known as the International Jukskei Association or IJA) was
	founded in 1979 by four National Jukskei Sports Bodies, namely:
	a) the South African Jukskei Board (corporately known as Jukskei South Africa),
	b) the United States Jukskei Association,
	c) the Namibian Jukskei Board (corporately known as Namibia Jukskei) and
	d) the Zimbabwean Jukskei Board.
1.4	The Emblem of the International Jukskei Federation was officially put into use in
	2000 to adapt to the image of the sport.
1.5	The Emblem of the International Jukskei Federation consists of:
	a) The shape of a jukskei player throwing a skey in gold on a navy background
	and navy on a white background.
	b) Two semi-circles in green and red that simbolize the world of Jukskei.
	c) For Umpires, the legal scale is included under the left arm.
	d) The words INTERNATIONAL JUKSKEI are affixed on a bar below the emblem.
	e) The words EXCO, UMPIRE or COMMITTEE can be added underneath.
	INTERNATIONAL JUKSKEI UMPIRE
1.6	The IJF shall be established for an indefinite period.
1.7	All member countries must ensure that the IJF emblem must not be used in full
	or any part thereof by any of their institutions.
2	DEFINITIONS AND TERMINOLOGY
2.1	For the purposes of this Constitution, the terminology specified in <b>Article 2</b>
	shall have the associated definitions (and meanings) assigned to them below,
	unless the context otherwise requires.
2.2	Unless the context otherwise requires in this Constitution the masculine
	gender shall include the feminine gender and the singular shall include the
2.2	plural, and vice versa.
2.3	In this Constitution, a reference to a Rule is a reference to a Rule of Play of the Sport Jukskei.
	a) In the event of any inconsistency between the Rules of Play and this
	Constitution, the Rules of Play shall prevail.
2.4	AFFILIATED means registered with a National Body or International
	Association, via affiliation (registration) with a Club and/or Union and/or Province or other Jukskei body affiliated with the National Body or

	International Association.
	a) It also refers to National Bodies or International Associations whose
	membership of the IJF has been accepted.
2.5	<b>AGE OF MAJORITY</b> is deemed to be acquired on a person's 18 <sup>th</sup> birthday.
2.6	GENERAL ASSEMBLY means the Annual Meeting of the Executive with IJF
	Members.
2.7	APPEAL COMMITTEE has the meaning given to it in Clause 13.3
2.8	APPEAL PANEL means the panel of individuals from which Appeal
	Committees may be selected in accordance with Clause 13.4
2.9	CHIEF OPERATIONS OFFICER or COO means the Secretary-Treasurer of the
	IJF's Exco, appointed by the General Assembly.
2.10	CLEARANCE means the written consent from the Management of both
	parties authorising a registered Jukskei player or participant to participate in
	a <b>new</b> National Body or International Association at the request of such <b>new</b>
	Body or Association and signed by the COO or Secretary of:
2.10.1	the player's or participant's <b>current</b> National Body or International
	Association
2.10.2	the National Body or International Association for whom the player or
	participant participated in <b>special</b> international events or matches (if
0.400	applicable); and
2.10.3	the player's or participant's <b>new</b> National Body or International Association.
2.11	<b>CONSTITUTION</b> means this document and its Articles and underlying Clauses
	that have been passed (or may hereafter be passed) by the General Assembly
	or Special General Assembly, relating to the management and promotion of the sport on an international level.
	a) The Constitution is binding on all affiliated National Bodies or Affiliated
	International Associations.)
2.12	CURRENT Body or Association means the National Body or International
	Association with which a player or participant is affiliated indirectly (via a
	union or member country.
2.13	<b>EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE</b> or <b>EXCO</b> means the Committee, which governs the
	day-to-day affairs of the IJF (described in <b>Article 11</b> ).
2.14	HOST BODY or ASSOCIATION means the National Body or International
	Association under whose jurisdiction an international match, tournament,
	championship or tour is played or takes place.
2.15	<b>HOME GROUND</b> means the ground within the geographical boundaries of the
	National Body or International Association at which the National Body's
	National Teams or the International Association's representative teams play
	(most of) their home fixtures and which is recognised as such by the National
	Body or International Association.
2.16	INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION means the recognized Inter-National Body
	that governs and promotes the sport of Jukskei in a cluster (region) of
	countries, being in membership of the IJF.
	a) In these countries, no National Body for Jukskei exists yet.
2.17	INTERNATIONAL JUKSKEI ACADEMY (IJA) is a Committee of the IJF Exco.
	Refer to Regulation Academy.
2.18	INTERNATIONAL JUKSKEI FEDERATION, hereafter known as the IJF, means the
	recognised International Sports Federation that governs and promotes the
2.40	sport of Jukskei on an international level.
2.19	INTERNATIONAL JUKSKEI PARTICIPATION COMMITTEE (IJPC) is a Committee

	of the IJF Exco. Refer to Regulation Participation.
2.20	INTERNATIONAL JUKSKEI UMPIRES COMMITTEE (IJUC) is a Committee of the
	IJF Exco. Refer to Regulation Umpires.
2.21	INTERNATIONAL MATCH means any match played between National
	representative teams selected by National Bodies or International
	Associations and approved by the IJF.
2.22	INTERNATIONAL MATCH PROTOCOL means the minimum standards and/or
	conditions that are regarded as necessary by the IJF for the conduct of
	international matches, tournaments, championships and tours as described
	in Regulation Participation.
2.23	INTERNATIONAL MATCH or TOURING AGREEMENT means the final
	arrangements as formally approved by Exco.
2.24	INTERNATIONAL STRATEGIC JUKSKEI COMMITTEE (ISJC) is a Committee of
	the IJF Exco.
2.25	INTERNATIONAL OLYMPIC COMMITTEE or IOC means an association created
	by the Congress of Paris in June 1894 and which is entrusted with the control
	and development of the Modern Olympic Games pursuant to the Olympic
	Charter.
2.26	JUNIOR or MINOR means a person who has not reached the Age of Majority
	as referred to in <b>Clause 2.5</b> of this Constitution.
2.27	NATIONAL BODY means the official body, being in membership of the IJF,
	which governs and promotes the sport of Jukskei in a country.
2.28	NATIONAL REPRESENTATIVE TEAM means a team on the highest level
	selected by a National Body or International Association to represent that
	body or association (it includes all players, officials and other relevant
	participants) during a match (es), tournament, championship or tour.
2.29	<b>NEW NATIONAL BODY</b> or <b>ASSOCIATION</b> means the National Body or
	International Association with which a player or participant wishes to become
	affiliated (see <b>Regulation Participation</b> ).
2.30	<b>RESIDENCE</b> means the place or location in which a player or participant has
	his/her primary home and Resident shall be construed accordingly.
2.31	<b>SPORT</b> means Jukskei played in accordance with the rules of the Sport, as
	determined by the International Jukskei Umpires Committee (IJUC) and
	approved by the IJF.
2.32	STANDING COMMITTEE means a group of people appointed by the Executive
	Committee (Exco) of the IJF to fulfil certain specialised duties, to conduct
	investigations and/or research or to perform other responsibilities, as
	determined by the Exco or General Assembly (see Clause 11.22).
2.33	TAFISA is THE ASSOCIATION FOR INTERNATIONAL SPORTS FOR ALL, an
	Association of international nature (with its seat in Frankfurt, Germany), with
	which sports confederations, federations, associations, academic or
	commercial institutions, countries, cities, as well as public or private
	institutions promoting the spirit of 'Sport for All' and physical activity, and
	recognized by the International Olympic Committee (IOC) and the TAFISA
2.24	Board, are or aspire to beaffiliated.
2.34	<b>UMPIRE</b> refers to a person who is called upon to act as a third-party
	negotiator or mediator to resolve a dispute or to make a judgment call during a Jukskei match.
2.35	UNION means a Provincial or Regional Body registered with a National Body
2.33	or International Association, via affiliation.
1	OF INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION, VIA ANNIALION.

2.36	<b>WORLD ANTI-DOPING AGENCY (WADA)</b> means the global agency responsible for drafting, regularly reviewing and promoting an internationally accepted Code (set of standards and regulations) aimed at optimal antidoping control of all sportsmen and –women.
3	VISION, MISSION AND VALUES
3.1	Vision
	Jukskei: A Sport for the World
3.2	Mission
	To promote sustainable growth of Jukskei's participation internationally
3.3	Values
	a) Integrity
	With integrity as one of Jukskei's core values, the sport Jukskei can be recognized as genuine in its dealings, promoting sportsmanship, and most importantly of all, providing a safe and fair environment for all those competing.
	b) Diversity
	Everyone in our diverse community, regardless of their gender, age, race or culture, is welcome to participate in Jukskei, as in Jukskei we strive to create an environment that fosters inclusion for all.
	c) Healthy Relationships
	Genuine relations between the players, coaches, managers and umpires
	generate more trust, better communication and a winning attitude. An
	open line of communication helps everyone be more honest with one
	another, which leads to stronger team cohesion.
	d) Commitment
	Commitment means complete dedication from the individual players
	and officials to the sport of Jukskei, as well as that they will support team
	recommendations and decisions.
4	LINDERLYING DRINGIRLES
4	UNDERLYING PRINCIPLES  The Forderestion strongly subscribes to and number of the strings to implement
4.1	The Federation strongly subscribes to and purposefully strives to implement the following underlying principles and values, and would expect respect for and endorsement of these expressions of sportsmanship and humanity by its members:
4.1.1	that human and social values are both essential and inherent to the practice
	of Jukskei (and the organization of Jukskei events) and the virtually international spirit of kinship and human solidarity between people and nations;
4.1.2	that the public image and personally enriching value of Jukskei as a Sport,
	expressed via statements by political and sports authorities; general public
	opinion; by the spoken, written and audiovisual mass media; and via any
	other credible means, is extremely important and should be actively and
	positively promoted and, if necessary, re-instated, by all IJF-related officials
4.1.3	and bodies; the technical constituents of competition and self-discipline, as regards
4.1.3	physical and mental preparation of all Jukskei players and officials, are publicly valued and promoted;
4.1.4	that, in adherence to the most recent Code of the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) and (if required) in collaboration with other sports federations and

	hadies the international compaign against drug taking and the guest for anti-
	bodies, the international campaign against drug-taking and the quest for anti-
	doping will increasingly receive prominence on all IJF and Jukskei-related
	forums and events and in all appropriate constitutions and regulations (also see <b>Article 19</b> );
4.1.5	the value and promotion of sports ethics, fair play, a healthy lifestyle and
4.1.5	sports environment, and measures aimed at the protection of the general
	environment are increasingly evident during all Jukskei matches, events and
	forums;
4.1.6	the involvement and role of women at all playing levels and in all managerial
	and officiating cadres of the sport is increasingly valued and enhanced;
4.1.7	the IJF is apolitical and refrains from promoting specific religious rituals and
	confessions, but instead draws its inspiration from relevant Values,
	Regulations and Provisions Governing International Sports Bodies such as the
	International Olympic Committee (IOC), the Association for International
	Sport for All (TAFISA) and appropriate others.
5	GOALS OF THE IJF
	The goals and objectives for which the IJF is established are:
5.1	to be the governing body for the conduct, administration, promotion and
	perseverance of the Sport of Jukskei on an international level, and in
	pursuance thereof
5.2	to encourage the growth of the sport of Jukskei on a worldwide basis, which
	entails accepting or refusing an application for affiliation and conditions from
	any National Body or International Association which controls any form of
	Jukskei, on such terms and conditions as may be considered appropriate by the
	Exco.
5.2.1	The terms and conditions are the following:
	a) Establishing meeting minutes
	b) List of committee members:
	i. Chair
	ii. Secretary
	iii. Member for Finances
	c) List of Senior members
	d) List of Junior members
	e) Constitution or date to be expected
5.3	to affiliate and liaise with such other bodies as may be appropriate in pursuit
	of these goals, including, amongst others, the Association for International
	Sport for All (TAFISA), the SportAccord movement, the National Horseshoe
	Pitchers' Association (NHPA) of the USA, as well as other relevant
	International Sports Bodies and Associations
5.4	the promotion of the individual and collective sports practice related to the
	general promotion of health, the social quality of life, and an active lifestyle
5.5	the active promotion of the IJF's underlying principles and values (see <b>Article</b>
	4), as well as the ethical values that go hand in hand with any sports-related
	activity
5.6	the promotion of and participation (if feasible) in events related to traditional
	games and sports, for example, the TAFISA World Sport for All Games
5.7	general participation in programs, training events, tournaments and activities
	related to the Sport for All concept, and the general promotion of Sport for
	All and physical activity amongmembers

5.8	to authorize and to lay down the conditions and terms under which a National
	Body or International Association visits another National Body or
	International Association, for the purposes of an international tour and/or the
	playing of (an) international match(es)
5.9	to conduct or commission research and development for improvements in
	Jukskei, its match formats and its equipment, including regulations for the
	experimentation with and the piloting of the aforementioned
5.10	to promote the importance and enhance the quality of Jukskei rules,
	standards, ethics, techniques, events, awards (e.g. players, teams or officials
	of the year) and educational programs amongst members of the IJF, as well as
	other relevant bodies involved in or related to the sport of Jukskei
5.11	to promulgate and secure uniformity in such rules and standards as may be
	necessary for the governance of Jukskei; international matches,
	championships, tournaments, tours and related activities including (but not
	limited to) the rules of the sport, coaching, officiating and umpiring standards
5.12	to strive for and maintain government, public and commercial recognition of
	the IJF as the international authority for and of the sport of Jukskei
5.13	to act as the final arbiter on all matters pertaining to the conduct of Jukskei
	on an international level
5.14	to establish and/or contractually negotiate, promote, conduct, assess and
	review education and training-related programs (and workshops) for players,
	officials and other participants of the sport
5.15	to formulate and implement appropriate policies on an international level,
	including policies in relation to equal opportunity, gender and racial equality,
	drugs in sport, health and safety, and such other social responsibility matters
	as arise from time to time
5.16	to maintain the authority and independence of its members; but at the same
	time coordinate, ensure close cooperation between and defend the common
	interests of its members
5.17	to ensure respect amongst members for the decisions made by the Executive
	and the General Assembly, as well as the Articles of this Constitution.
6	COMPLIANCE WITH THIS CONSTITUTION
6.1	Any member (a National Body or International Association) is deemed to have
	full knowledge of the content of this constitution.
6.2	A National Body or International Association must ensure that it complies
	with the articles of this constitution and must further ensure that it takes
	appropriate action to inform each of its member provinces, unions, regions,
	clubs or countries of the content of the constitution and their obligation to
	comply with it.
6.3	The Exco may from time to time issue guidelines in relation to the
	implementation of the articles or clauses of the constitution.
6.4	Members maintain full independence and autonomy in the administration of
	the sport of Jukskei.
	the sport of subsection

6.5	Members shall abide by the decisions taken by the General Assembly in relation to the common interests as reflected in this constitution. The underlying principles and values (Article 4), as well as the goals (Article 5) of the IJF, shall prevail in all actions taken by the IJF and its members.
7	OFFICIALS SEAT AND HEADQUARTERS
7.1	The official seat of the IJF is the hometown of the Chief Operations Officer (COO).
7.2	The Executive shall decide from time to time, on the location of the IJF headquarters.
8	LEGAL STATUS AND BODIES
8.1	The IJF is a non-governmental, non-profit, non-discriminatory federation of national Jukskei bodies or International Associations that is recognized by the international sports confederation it is affiliated to.
8.2	The IJF shall have full legal status, but only with regard to matters pertaining to the international governance of Jukskei and overseeing status with regard to matters pertaining to the national governance of Jukskei in the member countries.
8.3	Bodies of the IJF shall be the General Assembly, the Exco and Standing or other Committees established by the Exco or the General or Special General Assembly.
9	LANGUAGE
9.1	The official language of the IJF is English.
9.2	All meetings of the Executive and its Sub-Committees, as well as the General Assembly, shall be conducted in English (and/or in another language(s) if deemed appropriate).
