IJF WORLD TEAMS

In 2000 the 1st Men's and Women's World Teams were selected in Swakopmund, Namibia. The teams were:

Elna (Rossouw) vd Berg; Louise le Roux, Charl Marais (Team Manager), Santie Bernardt, San Beukes

Only two players from these world teams are still actively playing jukskei, namely Antoon Claasen and Elna vd Berg – 23 years later!



The Exco decided that it was once again time to appoint World Teams. This time, however, four teams were nominated in the age groups Senior Men and Women as well as Over 50 Men and Women. This gives more opportunities to give the jukskei players the recognition they need.

<u>Uganda</u>

Uganda has separated itself and is training and playing hard. There was a conversation with them via a video call in which they asked many questions. The game remains difficult to understand according to the book until you start playing it yourself. Scorekeeping continues to be a problem to understand and explaining it over the phone is not easy. The same applies to explaining how the game should be played. After an hour's conversation, we believe Herbert has a clearer picture of the game of jukebox. A visit by JSA is planned to Uganda this year and we believe it will explain to them even better how the game is played.

A visit by a delegation of 5 players is planned in August during which training will be given regarding playing, coaching as well as referees.

News from Jukskei Namibia



Napso Blitz tournament

The Association of Private Schools in Namibia (Napso) has, after nearly three years of negotiations with junior jukskei, given permission for jukskei to form part of one of their tournaments.

They call the tournament, the Napso Blitz tournament.

During these tournaments, there is participation in rugby, hockey, netball and now jukskei. The name Blitz series already gives an indication that everything happens very quickly, and the other three codes are then played in seven to a side. The series consists of three legs and the winner will be determined at the end of the series.

Jukskei then had to adapt to fit within these norms and had to look at a different format of the game. That is why the name of Action jukskei saw the light.

Action jukskei should then be played in a shortened version.

How does it work?

- Match consists of throwing six overs.
- Pins and lays cancel as with any jukskei match.
- ◆ The score is then taken after the six innings
- ◆ The team with the most points after the six innings then wins the game and earns four points. (4)
- If a team scores more than eighteen points in the limited innings, the team earns a bonus point. (1)
- If the team that loses by seven or less points then the team earns one bonus point. (1)

During the weekend of 24 and 25 March 2023, the first leg of the Napso Blitz series took place. The children really enjoyed the jukskei because the game was nice and short and finished very quickly.

Three schools participated for the first time namely:

- ♦ WAP (Windhoek Private School)
- ♦ Elnantan (Stampriet Private School)
- ◆ Tsumeb Gymnasium (Tsumeb Private School)

After the matches, the points are as follows:

- ◆ Elanathan 10 (Win both games with a bonus point)
- WAP 4 (Win a game without a bonus point)
- Tsumeb
 1 (Loose one of the games with less than seven points, and earn a bonus point)

We are very excited to the new form of jukskei especially for beginners of the game.

The format is adaptable depending on the circumstances.

Beginners get the basic principle of the game, and can then get an introduction to the game as a whole at a later stage.


